THE GOAL OF THE PROGRAMME

One of our main objective is to encourage talented but disadvantaged students to complete their university studies and stay in the region they live (Borsod-Abaúj-Zemplén, Hajdú-Bihar, Heves, Jász-Nagykun-Szolnok, Nógrág, and Szabolcs-Szatmár-Bereg Counties).

For its fullfilnent goal the Foundation has launched a scholarship Programme that aims to

- Improve the participating students' regional and social identities
- Develop skills that can help students to access the labour market



The three main elements of the Programme:

• Financial support

Every participant is granted 2000 USD / an academic year

• Tutorial support

The participants receive mentoring help from a personal tutor (university professor)

• Participants' volunteer work

Participants, based on their study profile and in co-operation with a local civil organization, agree to work out and manage a one year volunteer project called 'For the region in the region'

THE HISTORY OF THE PROGRAMME

The idea of the Carpathian Equal Opportunities Scholarship Programme came from Mr Fred Robey who is a committed donor of the Carpathian Foundation Network; in 2005 he donated 100,000 USD to launch the fund. It was the donator wish to start a 5-year education sponsorship programme in five countries of the Carpathian region.

ACHIEVEMENTS

2006/2007, the first year of the Programme was a pilot year, when, we chose one or two high talented students from each of the participating countries. In June 2007 the completion of this trial year was successfull. In the second academic year, realizing the demand, the Foundation supported two students, three in 2008/2009 and again two in 2009/2010.

FUTURE PLANS

Mr Fred Robey's 5-year term for the programme runs out in 2011. The Carpathian Foundation Hungary is committed to find other donors to continue the Programme and to extend it as follows:

• Internship for students

The students will be able to spend an internship period at local municipalities, civil organizations or companies. This will give them an insight to the problems of the region, will introduce them to professionals and will improve their chances on the local or regional labour market.

• Student exchange programme

We want to encourage student exchange programmes involving the participating institutions and organizations within and outside the Carpathian region.

• Encouraging young mothers to continue their studies at university We will establish child care units at the participating universities which will enable young mothers to attend lectures and study (at the moment it is only the College of Gyöngyös that provides this facility).
